Jefferson Chamber Opposes Efforts to Bring Politics Back to the Levee Boards

METAIRIE, LA – April 25, 2014 – The Jefferson Chamber of Commerce Board of Directors opposes Senate Bill No. 79 and Senate Bill No. 629, which would dissolve the Southeast Louisiana Flood Protection Authorities, and put the administration of flood control directly under the Governor's jurisdiction.

The Jefferson Chamber represents the largest parish in the New Orleans Region and is surrounded by water and the threat of water coming into our homes and businesses. These two bills by Senator Robert Adley of northwest Louisiana, greatly compromise the independence of the levee boards, whose service is important to the citizens and businesses of southeast Louisiana.

"In 2006, the Jefferson Chamber supported levee board reforms in light of catastrophic levee breaches caused by Hurricane Katrina," said Jefferson Chamber President, Todd Murphy. "Voters went to the polls and sent a strong message to depoliticize the levee boards and replace them with professionals with industry experience; much more of a qualification than simply having political ties."

Today, Senator Robert Adley, of Benton, LA, wants to erode the reforms that were pushed for by citizens from the area most impacted. Senate Bill No. 79 undermines the procedures that protect qualified board members, granting the governor the power to remove board members at his own initiative. If that were not enough, Senate Bill No. 629 essentially abolishes the East and West Bank Unified Levee Boards, and moves away from professionalism and into politics.
